Sports/Commercial Fishermen View:

- The tribes are going to put us out of business.
- Who ensures oversight, regulation, and enforcement?
- What about tourism?
- Won't it impact our taxes?
- Will cost of seafood increase?
- What is the economic effect on sporting goods stores?
- What about the supply of fish?

Property Owners:

- Who monitors the amounts harvested?
- Are there licenses needed?
- Who decides which half?
- What rights do property owners have if they purchased land before 1974?
- Do tribes need a license to harvest? From whom?
 Seasonal?
- How do I, as a property owner, know who is for real?
- How are we kept informed?

State Government View:

- Must listen to sports fisherman, property owners, commercial fishermen, and tribes.
- Decide what their enforcement role will be.
- Understand the co-responsibilities for managing limited resources, water, access, and land.
- Staff are involved in an agreement—the state did not have a voice in making the decision.

Tribal View:

- We aren't getting 50%, we are giving up 50% of the 100% we have since time immemorial.
- We need to feed our families.
- The salmon is sacred and used in our ceremonies.
- We need fishing for our economy.
- Maintaining the salmon is part of our environmental cycle of life.
- When the treaty was finally honored, it felt like respect was finally granted.
- If not managed well, 50% of nothing is nothing.
