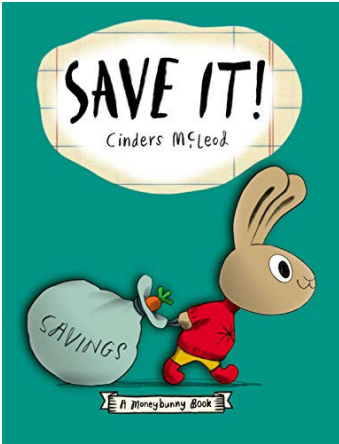


Save It! A Moneybunny Book
